



Code of principles for NASMA members

Introduction

NASMA is a professional interest organisation that aims to bring together those working in the field of student money advice. By doing this NASMA provides an effective support network for advisers and administrators, access to high quality, affordable training and opportunities for discussion and input into national and regional policies.

We recognise that NASMA members are employed by different organisations that have their own codes of practice and working arrangements and it is not our intention to interfere with these in any way. The purpose of this code is to set out some of the core values and principles that by joining the organisation, NASMA members are expected to adhere to.

Objectives, values and principles in relation to joining NASMA

By joining NASMA you are agreeing to:-

- Act with integrity, honesty, fairness and professional impartiality
- Treat the opinions and ideas of your fellow NASMA members with respect. This is just as relevant whether these opinions and/or ideas are shared electronically e.g. the NASMA mailbase or in person.
- Be committed to providing students with access to free, accurate, non judgemental and impartial Information Advice and Guidance
- Keep up to date with changes to any relevant legislation, practice and policies that may have an impact on students
- Contribute wherever possible to the work of NASMA in your region
- Consider and respond to any consultations that NASMA are asked to contribute to wherever appropriate
- Promote the benefits of NASMA membership to those working in the sector
- Adhere to the mailbase protocol
- Remember what it was like to be a new member and try wherever possible to welcome new members into the 'NASMA community'.
- Work towards the objects of the company as defined by section 3 of the Memorandum of Association.

Remember that through your involvement with NASMA you may be viewed as representing the organisation even if you are not. Please act in the same way as you would if representing your employer.

If you are requested to represent NASMA at any event you should seek advice from the NASMA chairperson or relevant deputy before you do so.
